Key Terms

ATIN: Adoption Taxpayer Identification Number, issued by the IRS while a final domestic adoption is pending and the child does not have a social security number.

Dependent: An individual who may be claimed as a dependent on another person's tax return; that is, someone who meets all applicable dependency tests.

Gross Income: All income received in the form of money, goods, property, and services that is not exempt from tax.

ITIN: Individual Taxpayer Identification Number issued by the IRS to individuals who are not eligible for a social security number.

Tax Credits: A dollar-for-dollar reduction in the tax. Can be deducted directly from taxes owed.

	State the presentation time.	Pub 4012, Who Must File
Who Must File?	Ask students what helps determine if an individual must file. Answer: Age, gross income, filing status, dependent status, blindness. Emphasize the importance of the intake and interview sheet at this stage of the process.	Visuals: Pub 4012, Who Must File <u>Charts A, B, and</u> <u>C</u> Internet: Interactive Tax Assistant: <u>Determine if you</u> <u>have to file a return</u>
	Use the decision tree to clear up common misconceptions about filing requirements.	

Who Should File?	Ask : In what situations would a person want to file if they are not required to? Answer : Refund of withheld taxes, refundable credit.	Visual: Pub 4012, Who Must File <u>Chart D</u>
	Review where information on withheld taxes and refund eligibility can be found.	
	Out of scope : Taxpayers who qualify for the health coverage tax credit.	
Verifying Taxpayer Identity	Point out how to verify identity of taxpayers.	Visual: <u>Form 13614-C</u> , Parts I-III
	Remind students that identity theft can occur during tax time and it is important to verify the taxpayer's	Pub 4012, <u>Personal Information Part I, Tab</u> <u>B, Starting a Return/Filing Status</u>
	identity.	Internet:
	Emphasize importance of entering names and identification numbers accurately to prevent processing delays.	Taxpayer Guide to Identify Theft

	Ask : What are acceptable TINs? Answer : SSN, ITIN, ATIN.
